Upay (Under Privileged's Advancement by Youth) by Varun Shrivastava

Upay, an NGO started by a 2009 pass out of HT-Kharagpur, Varun Shrivastava is not new to the people of Nagpur. Today Upay works in 3 states, it has 20 centres, where over 250 volunteers work to help 1500 children. 'Maximum students in HTs come from a middle-class background.

Most of us know the struggles of education. And hence, everyone of us has a belief that we must pay back to the society whatever we get, in any possible manner,' said Shrivastava while speaking with Lokmat Times.

Varun Shrivastava believes that education leads to development. He taught underprivileged kids in the areas surrounding Kharagpur in the year 2008, when he was a third year student. 'It

was not an organisation then, we did not have a mission and vision, we just knew that these kids needed education and they would do wonders for themselves, just like everyone else.'

Upay started its first centre in Kumhari, some 5 kms from Mauda, as Varun took up a job at NTPC, Mauda. It was his regular chore to teach the kids in the vicinity after his office hours. 'I then happened to come to Nagpur every Saturday and Sunday, where I noticed that the kids begging at the traffic signals.

this is how the concept of footpath school came into existence. I randomly started teaching on the footpath, people stopped and learnt a thing or two. This activity later gained momentum and socially oriented youth joined in to devote their time,' added Shrivastava.

Later, with the help of his juniors, colleagues and teachers at IIT-K, Varun built up a team and since its formation in 2010, Upay has never stopped working for the upliftment of the kids. The volume of the NGO is increasing everyday Vidarbha Vaibhav by Hemant Chafale
